DIRECTIONS

From Downtown Henderson/Black Mountain/ Boulder City

Once traveling on Interstate 515/93 going North, exit at W Sunset Road going West; you will pass the Galleria at Sunset on your right. Continue on Sunset Road up the hill until you get to Valle Verde Dr. Make a right turn onto Valle Verde Dr. and continue until the road ends at an intersection with Sunset Way. Make a right turn onto Sunset Way. USN is the last building on the left before the end of the mesa.

From North Las Vegas/ Summerlin

Once traveling on US 95 going South (this will turn into Interstate 515/93 South as you pass Downtown Las Vegas), take the exit for Tropicana Ave (exit 68) and make a left at the bottom of the exit ramp to go East on Tropicana Ave. After 0.5 mile, make a right turn onto Mountain Vista Street. Proceed 2 miles on Mountain Vista up the hill to the top of the mesa until you get to the intersection of Sunset Road and Sunset Way (The Ethel M chocolate factory will be on your left). Make a left turn onto Sunset Way. USN is the last building on the left before the end of the mesa.

Park in the large parking lot to the east of the building (towards the end of the mesa). The check-in will be held in the Student Lounge (signs will be posted).

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

THE NEW IDSA/ATS COMMUNITY-ACQUIRED PNEUMONIA PRACTICE GUIDELINES – A CASE-BASED APPROACH (0.2 CEU)

1. Summarize the key recommendations from the joint 2007 IDSA/ATS guidelines on community-acquired pneumonia (CAP).
2. Discuss the role of combination antibiotic therapy in the treatment of CAP, and the evidence both in favor and against its routine use.
3. Review key changes to previous CAP guidelines and the corresponding implications for patient care.
4. Relate the impact of resistant *Streptococcus pneumoniae* on appropriate antibiotic selection in the treatment of CAP.
5. Recognize the patient profile in which combination antibiotic therapy is warranted to ensure optimal outcomes.

NEVADA PHARMACY LAW (0.1 CEU)

1. Apply information about new regulations that permit pharmacists in some work environments to take scheduled breaks.
2. Identify the documentation requirements for DEA Form 222.
3. Recognize the regulations that pertain to controlled substance prescribing, dispensing, documentation and surrendering of documents during investigations of illegal acts.
4. Identify legal requirements for prescription labeling, order transcription, and documentation of patient counseling.
5. Interpret the Nevada Board of Pharmacy requirements with regards to changes of employment and changes of home address.
