

Alumni & Adjunct Faculty Interlibrary Loan Policy

Interlibrary Loans (ILLs) are available through the Library and Learning Resources Center (LLRC). An ILL is the process in which a person may borrow an article or book from another library, if the item is unavailable from their own institution.

1. Patrons must fill out the ILL form either online or via a hard copy form provided by the Assistant Librarian.
2. Payment for request by cash, credit card or check made payable to the University of Southern Nevada, must be made at time of request.
3. Payments will be refunded if request is unable to be filled.
4. In the event a check is bounced, the patron is responsible for the amount of the check plus the non-sufficient fund fees, to be paid in cash or by Money Order made payable to the University of Southern Nevada.
5. Additional Interlibrary Loan requests will not be accepted until previous account balance is paid in full.

Orders may not be cancelled once the order is placed. Refunds will not be made for cancellations.
